





Regional Integration

According to UN Recommendation Number 36:

- Single Windows can be seen in a broader context as tools not only to improve national competitiveness but also to promote regional economic growth.
- The obvious advantage would be the ability to communicate trade-related information easily and quickly, and more cost effectively for both government and the trading community.

Pilot Project: eCO Exchange

Parallel-track bilateral exchange project envisioned.

 - Jamaica
 - Suriname
- Between T&T and Latin American Countries:
 - Chile
 - Panama

Primary Drivers

Rationale for e-Certificates of Origin (eCOs)

- Required for preferential treatment in the importing country
- Issuing Agency reports to the MTI
- Standardised Document
- Reduces trade transaction costs to exporters

Primary Drivers (cont'd)

Rationale for Potential Partners

- CARICOM:
 - High volume of eCO transactions with countries identified
 - Progress with trade systems
- Latin America:
 - Partial Scope Trade Agreement with Panama
 - Trade Negotiations currently ongoing with Chile


Mandate

- Steps for CARICOM:
 - Proposal will be presented at the next COTED meeting
 - Seek Approval from CARICOM
 - Provisions inserted into CARICOM FTA
- Steps for Latin America:
 - Approach preferred candidates
 - Garner buy-in at political level
 - Sort out any legal issues in trade agreement




Model of Exchange

eCO T&T (Import) and CARICOM Interconnection **System**





eCO T&T (Import) and Latin America **Interconnection System**






